The following is a brief description of the agenda items for Tuesday, May 14, 2019:

ITEM NO. 9, is a presentation of Citizens Academy certificates to Janelle Bassett, Larissa Even, David Hardin, Kate Nevins, Juan Reyes and Kylee Swendig.

ITEM NO. 10, is resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit the 2020 Community Development Block Grant application to St. Louis County with the following allocation: \$30,000 for playground improvements for Greenwood Park; \$24,000 for sidewalk improvements; and \$10,000 for subsistence payments. The City Council has previously discussed allocating the Community Development Block Grant funds at their previous two Council meetings.

ITEM NO. 11, is a resolution to authorize the submission of a 2019 T.R.I.M. grant to the Missouri Department of Conservation for a citywide tree inventory. Our last tree inventory was taken in 2002 and needs to be updated.

ITEM NO. 12, is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to renew the city's dental insurance coverage for city employees with Delta Dental Plan of Missouri. The cost of dental insurance will increase 4% for the 2019-2020 insurance year. The city pays for employee dental insurance and the employee pays for family dental insurance.

ITEM NO. 13, is a resolution to accept the sole bid of Ready to Roll Concrete LLC in the amount of \$23,226 for sidewalk replacements in eligible areas of the city that qualifies for Community Development Block Grant funds. \$15,000 was set aside in the 2018 Community Development Block Grant funds for sidewalk replacement. We have asked the County to transfer the additional funds of \$8,226 from the Home Improvement Loan Program which has a surplus.

ITEM NO. 14, Bill 6116 is an ordinance amending the Maplewood Code of Ordinances to modify Chapter 16, Courts, Section 16-3, Court costs, filing fees by amending paragraph (a) 4. In August 2003 the Crime Victims Compensation fund was increased from \$5.00 to \$7.50. Our municipal court has been collecting the \$7.50 but our ordinance was never changed to reflect the state increase. This bill has been read two times and tabled and is now ready for final Council action.

Subject: 2019 T.R.I.M. Cost-Share Application for an Updated City-Wide Tree Inventory

The Tree Resource Improvement & Maintenance Grant (T.R.I.M.) is a competitive, cost-share tree care program administered by the Missouri Department of Conservation and the Missouri Community Forest Council. Grant recipients can receive up to 60% of the money needed for a project. An additional 15% is available to cities that are designated as a Tree City USA which we are. The maximum amount allowed is \$10,000. Eligible projects include tree inventories, hazardous tree removal or pruning, tree planting, etc.

Our existing tree inventory needs to be updated (last completed in 2002), therefore staff would like to apply for a T.R.I.M. grant to accomplish this. A tree inventory allows us to make more informed decisions about species diversity, planting locations and the condition of the existing tree stock. City staff recently attended a grant workshop and received preliminary approval from State of Missouri Community Forester Mark Gruber to submit a grant application for a tree inventory which is a requirement for the grant. Based on preliminary research, a tree inventory would cost approximately \$15,000 of which the City would be responsible for approximately \$5,000 if we receive the maximum grant amount allowed.

Attached is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to renew the city's dental insurance coverage for city employees with Delta Dental Plan of Missouri for the period of June 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020. The cost of dental insurance increased 4%. The cost of employee dental insurance was \$39.59 per month and will increase \$1.56 per month to \$41.15 per month per employee. The city pays the employee cost of dental insurance. The cost of dependent dental insurance is paid by the employee.

This is the only dental insurance plan in the St. Louis area that offers a broad network of dentists for employees to choose from. Delta Dental Plan of Missouri has been the city's dental insurance provider for the past 34 years.

Subject: Sidewalk Replacements 2018 Community Development Block Grant Funds

A request for bids was placed in the St. Louis Business Journal on March 29, 2019 for sidewalk replacements at the following locations that are within eligible areas for CDBG fund activities: (1) the intersection of Manchester and Marshall (southwest corner to the Marietta parking lot entrance), (2) 7300 block of Hazel (by the Evangel Temple Church) and (3) 7300 block of Maple (several sections along the block). The request for bids was emailed to the following companies: Ready to Roll Concrete, Century Building Group, Byrne & Jones, RV Wagner, Foster's Concrete and Spencer's Contracting. Since this project is utilizing block grant funds, St. Louis County also sent the bid specifications out to numerous county approved contractors.

Bids were publicly opened on April 15, 2019 and one (1) bid was received. Ready to Roll Concrete, LLC submitted the sole bid in the amount of **\$23,226**. The City has set aside \$15,000 of our 2018 block grant funds for this project and has asked the County to transfer the additional funds of \$8,226 from the home improvement loan program which currently has a surplus.

All sums collected pursuant to this section shall be distributed as follows.
