The sewer lateral account has run out of money and the city will not receive additional funding until December. We still have sewer laterals that need repairing and would use this transfer to tide us over until additional revenues are received from our sewer lateral account.

Amendment 1 reduces how much money state legislator candidates can accept from each donor per election. Senators and representatives would be constitutionally barred from soliciting contributions on state property.

Lobbyists gifts to lawmakers would be capped at \$5 per present and retiring representatives and senators would have to wait two years after serving in office before taking a paid lobbying job.

Finally, the amendment would overhaul the redistricting process by appointing a state demographer the task of redrawing districts based on partisan fairness and competiveness in order to insure neither Democrats nor Republicans receive unfair advantages.

Sir:

Upon Maplewood City Council approval, the 2018/19 police department budget allocated \$43,000.00 in Proposition P funds to purchase ten (10) mobile data terminals for patrol vehicles.

Note that on September 11, 2018, the Maplewood City Council approved the purchase of two (2) Panasonic Win 10 Pro Toughbook mobile data terminals from Turn-Key Mobile, Inc., by means of Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) funds previously awarded to the Maplewood Police Department through the Missouri Department of Public Safety. Refer to Sub-Award #2017-LLEBG-049.

The State of Missouri (as a participating state entity) entered into a Master Agreement with the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) by awarding Contract #MNWNC-124 to Turn-Key Mobile, Inc. on May 17, 2018, for the purchase of Panasonic Corporation computer systems.

Accordingly, the Maplewood Police Department made a Request for Proposal from Turn-Key Mobile, Inc. for the purchase of eight (8) Panasonic Win 10 Pro Toughbook mobile data terminals.

Turn-Key Mobile, Inc. submitted Proposal #21934 dated September 17, 2018, to the City of Maplewood for the purchase of eight (8) Panasonic Win 10 Pro Toughbook mobile data terminals for \$32,446.40 through NASPO Contract #MNWNC-124.

I request authorization to purchase eight (8) Panasonic Win 10 Pro Toughbook mobile data terminals from Turn-Key Mobile, Inc. at a cost of \$32,446.40 by means of NASPO Contract #MNWNC-124.
